Sanders Creek Trail

Wisconsin



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The Sanders Creek Trail begins on the north end of Boscobel and winds southward through town along its namesake creek. The paved pathway offers a pleasant experience in a greenspace bordering quiet neighborhoods, providing convenient and safe passage underneath roadways.

Trailside benches offer the chance to take in the views of scenic creek, which is frequently bordered by trees; lucky observers may also see eagles along the route. At Labelle Street, travelers will reach Boy Scout Park, which offers a playground.

At its north end, the trail connects with the developing [Wisconsin River Trail](#), which will one day form a loop along both sides of the river and reach Wauzeka.

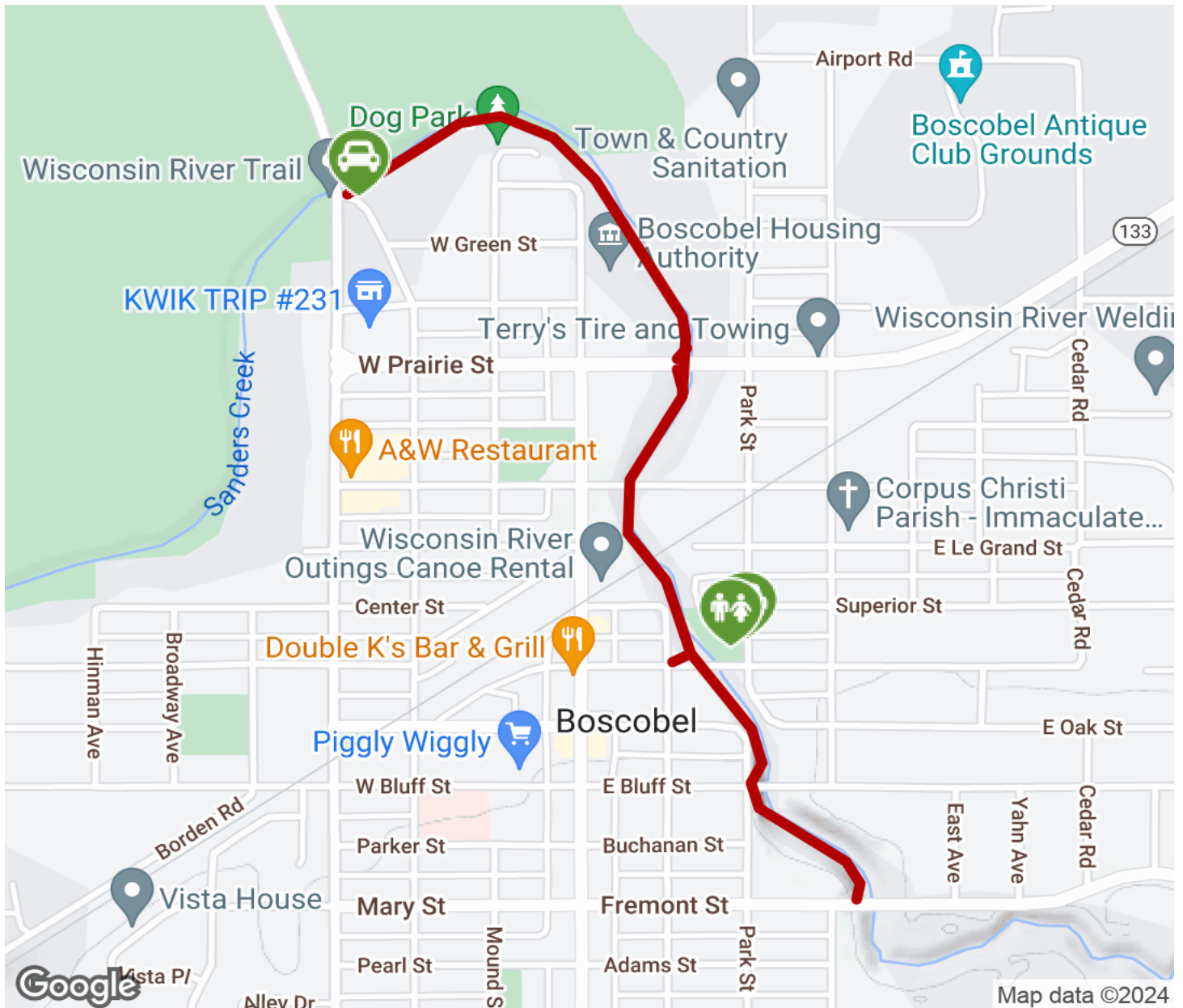
Parking & Trail Access
