Kitty Bryan Dill Memorial Parkway National Recreation Trail

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The Kitty Bryan Dill Memorial Parkway is a narrow concrete path that runs for over two miles through the eastern Mississippi community of West Point — forming a roughly 4-mile loop using city streets — which links five local parks along the former routes of the Columbus & Greenville and the Mobile & Ohio railroads. Along the paved trail you will find lighted walkways, open areas, pleasant natural landscaping with native hardwood trees, picnic areas, gazebos, arbors, fountains and a windmill. Benches under the shade of trees allow for relaxing and enjoying the scenery.

In 2005, the Kitty Dill Memorial Parkway was designated by the US Department of the Interior as a National Recreational Trail.

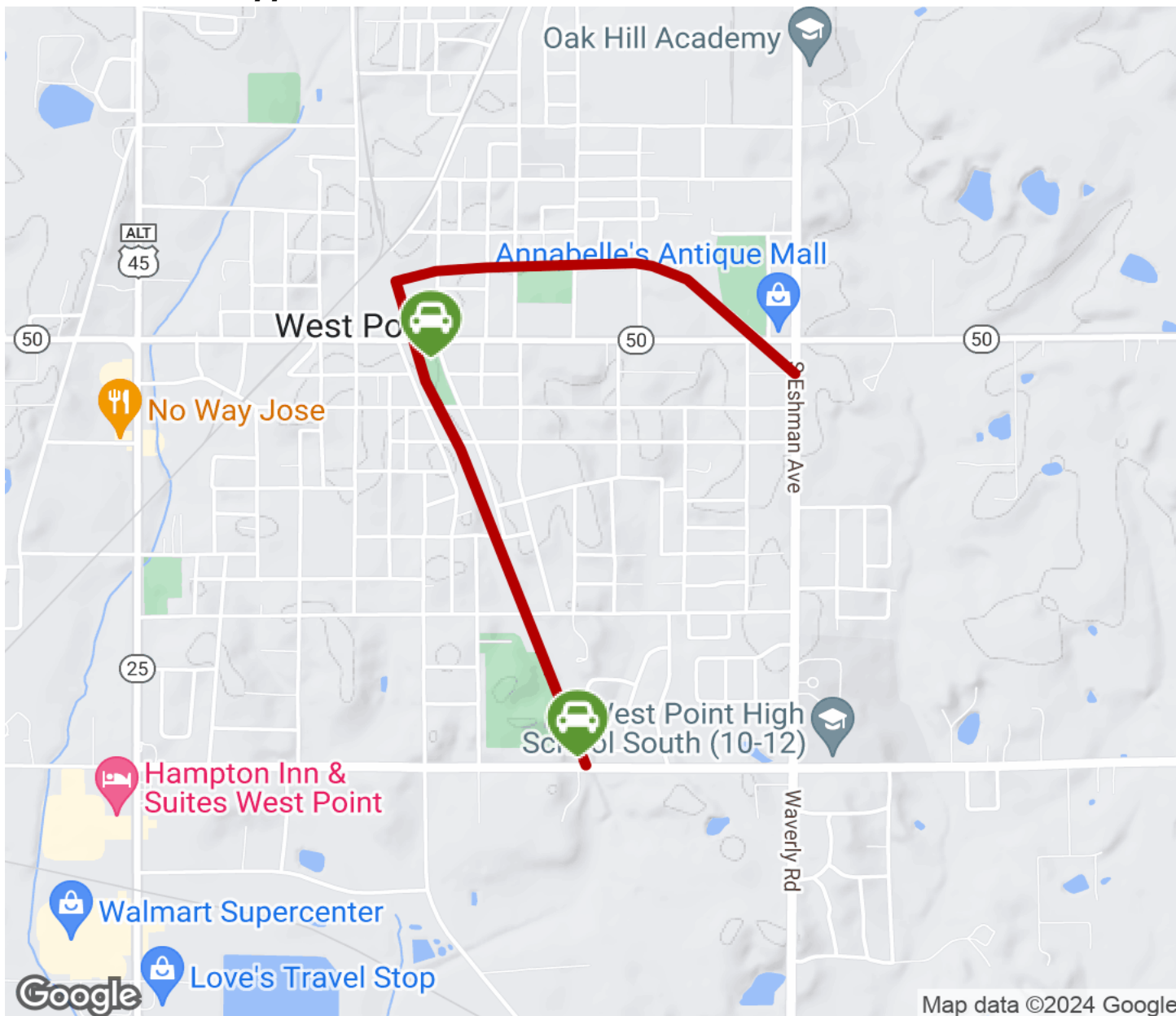
Parking & Trail Access
