Cambridge Greenway hugs the Lamoille River through the village of Jeffersonville in northern Vermont, about 30 miles northeast of



Cambridge Greenway hugs the Lamoille River through the village of Jeffersonville in northern Vermont, about 30 miles northeast of Burlington. It is a four-season trail, popular with cross-country skiers and snowmobilers in the winter.

Although less than 2 miles, the unpaved trail offers pleasant views, including the Poland Covered Bridge at its eastern end. The bridge, built in 1887, is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

The route follows the Lamoille Valley Railroad and the trail part of a larger developing network called the [Lamoille Valley Rail Trail](#), which will one day span 93 miles across northern Vermont.

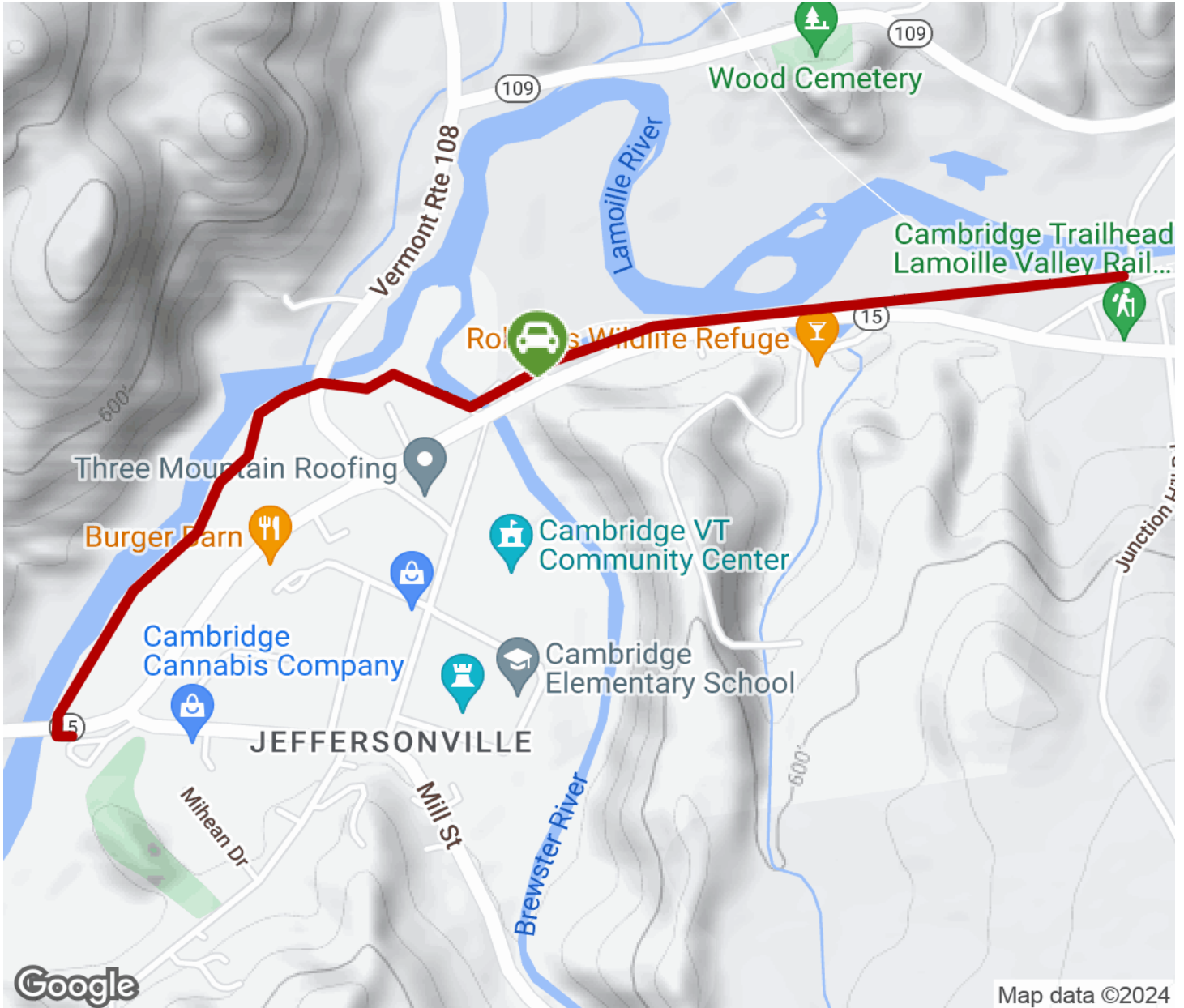
