The Roger F. Snyder Greenway is an ambitious project to create a citywide trail system in Albemarle, North Carolina. A portion of the trail is open for use, including two disconnected segments on a former Norfolk Southern Railway corridor. The project is named for a former mayor of Albemarle who secured funding for the popular greenway.

The trail connects residents of Albemarle with the city's downtown. A segment along US 52 leads to Don B. Montgomery Memorial Park, which features the home playing field for Stanly County's American Legion Baseball team. The trail winds through the park, ultimately following scenic Little Long Creek south to W. Main Street.


Parking & Trail Access
